Job Description: The Den Chief is a Boy Scout who assists a Cub Scout Den Leader or Webelos Den Leader in running their meetings and activities.

- Minimum Time in Troop: **1 yr**
- Prerequisite Offices: **None**
- Appointed by: **Scoutmaster**
- Term/Limitations: **Till Den Crosses Over/Till Den Crosses Over**

Den Chief Duties:

- Knows the purposes of Cub Scouting.
- Helps Cub Scouts achieve the purposes of Cub Scouting.
- Serves as the activities assistant at den meetings.
- Is a friend to the boys in the den.
- Helps lead weekly den meetings.
- Helps the den in its part of the monthly pack meetings.
- Knows the importance of the monthly theme and pack meeting plans.
- Meets regularly with the den leader to review den and pack meeting plans. Meets as needed with adult members of the den, pack, and troop.
- Set a good example.
- Enthusiastically and correctly wears the Scout uniform.
- Lives by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Shows and helps develop Scout Spirit.
- Attends most Scout meetings and camping trips.
